The Boone County Histori-
cal Society is pleased to wel-
come **Paul A. Tenkotte, Ph.D.**,
for his presentation entitled *The
Roebling Suspension Bridge*.
This event is co-sponsored by

Dr. Tenkotte is Professor of
History and Director of the Cen-
ter for Public History at North-
ern Kentucky University. He is
a frequent speaker on regional
topics and has co-edited, with
colleagues, three recent books
including *Gateway City: Cov-
ington, KY, 1815-2015* (Clerisy
Press, 2015), *Cincinnati: The
Queen City* (Cinti. Museum



Center, 2014), and the
*Encyclopedia of North-
ern Kentucky* (University
Press of Kentucky,
2009).

Bridge is a Northern
Kentucky landmark. It
was the first bridge to
span the Ohio River and
had the longest span in
the world when it opened
to traffic in 1867.

AN OPPORTUNITY TO MEET WWII HERO JIM “PEE WEE” MARTIN, PARATROOPER, U.S. 101ST AIRBORNE DIVISION, SPONSORED BY BCPL

Boone County Public Library is sponsoring a presentation by WWII Hero Jim “Pee Wee” Martin on Saturday, September 23 at 1 pm at Florence Baptist Church, 642 Mt. Zion Road in Florence. The event is co-sponsored by Simon Kenton Sons of the American Revolution, Boone County Daughters of the American Revolution, Florence Baptist Church and Martin’s Manager, Doug Barber.

Martin was part of the U.S. 101st Airborne Division that parachuted onto the beach near Normandy in an effort to retake France and the rest of Europe from Nazi Germany. His unit actually touched down in enemy territory the night before D-Day, on June 5, 1944. Martin and his fellow paratroopers fought for 43 days at Normandy before they moved on to invade Holland, fight at the Battle of the Bulge and assist with the take-over of Berchtesgaden, Hitler’s fortress in the German Alps.

At the age of 93, Pee Wee Martin once again jumped out of a plane over Normandy, this time to mark the 70th anniversary of D-Day. Many of Martin’s experiences with the 101st Airborne Division were included in the popular HBO mini-series, *Band of Brothers*.

Our Library’s popular bus tour will be included on the National Park Service’s **National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom** website.

Additionally, the Library’s Local History Department has been accepted into the program as an Underground Railroad research facility, joining over 100 facilities, sites and programs across 25 states, including the District of Columbia and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The Library’s next Underground Railroad Boone County bus tour will be offered on Wednesday, September 20, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. There is a \$40 fee to cover the cost of the bus and lunch. free admission & lunch, lots of door prizes. Bring your children and grandchildren! No fees, no registration required.



The Boone County Historical Society provides program meetings at 7pm on the third Thursday evenings of January, March, May, July, September and November.

The Society hosts a number of exhibits at the BCHS Museum (*see page 3*) each year. Most items for these exhibits are borrowed on a temporary basis from our members and friends, and do not belong to the Society.
