The BCCHS Board met on Thursday, June 20, 2019, at the Library. Our discussions included a number of important topics about which you should know. Please take the time to read this synopsis and contact one of us (phone numbers on back page) regarding your response:

Rescheduling of BCCHS January 16, 2020 meeting: Due to anticipated winter weather that typically impacts our attendance at our January meeting, the January 2020 meeting will be cancelled and rescheduled by a meeting in April 2020 assuming the Library meeting room is available. If this temporary rescheduling proves satisfactory and the program meets attendance expectations, we will bring before the membership a motion to permanently replace the January meeting with one in April, to change the By-Laws accordingly.

July 6, 2019, Boone County Heritage Day:
The Chalkfest portion of this event is being eliminated this year, and this elimination will probably be permanent. We do express our great appreciation for the outstanding efforts of **Linda Whittenburg, owner of Cabin Arts in Burlington**, who, through the past years, has organized and produced the Chalkfest. The Artwork of the late Mary Amanda Moore:

As you may recall, a beautiful baptistery wall hand-painted by the late Boone County artist Mary Amanda Moore was recently salvaged from an old church in Stringtown, a tiny community on the Ohio River in Boone County. The painting is now displayed in the Ferguson Community Center (historic Courthouse). The idea of collecting information on Mary Amanda Moore's artwork, with the possibility of creating a book, has been suggested. We do know that she painted many of these peaceful scenes in churches in Indiana and Kentucky, and perhaps elsewhere. If you, our members, know of any churches where Ms. Moore painted the back wall of a baptismal pool, or any other works by this dear lady, please advise one of our Board Members so that we can make a list of known sites. ABOUT THE BOONE COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The **mission** of the Boone County Historical Society is to develop awareness and promote appreciation of the history of Boone County, Kentucky. We are fortunate to partner with the Boone County Public Library.

The Boone County Historical Society provides program meetings at 7pm on the third Thursday evenings of January, March, May, July, September and November.

Meetings (except for July) are held at the Boone County Public Library, Main Library, 1786 Burlington Pike, Burlington, Kentucky. July "out-and-about" meetings are held at various locations around the County.

The Society hosts a number of exhibits at the BCHS Museum (*see page 3*) each year. Most items for these exhibits are borrowed on a temporary basis from our members and friends, and do not belong to the Society. We greatly appreciate being entrusted with these loaned items that relate to our exhibits.

Items in our permanent collection have been donated by individuals and families who desire to share with others items of historical significance to Boone County. Their generosity is gratefully appreciated.
